Honey Bernas, Director of Administrative Services, presented this item to the RCA Board. She gave history on this policy which has previously been before the RCA Board and Executive Committee. She stated that staff solicited comments and received valuable input from all of the Member Agencies. The policy was simplified, clarified, and definitions were added. Flood Control Projects were deleted from the policy to allow for a separate policy for those projects. She reviewed and gave an overview of each section of the policy. Several of the Executive Committee members spoke concerning the development of the policy, the reasons why and how the policy was developed, and the importance of this policy for their city/county staff to understand fee credits and waivers. Several Board Members asked questions which staff answered.

Board Member Washington suggested that the following language be added under Section IV.A. DECISIONS. "In the event of a disagreement between RCA and a Member Agency regarding Fee Credits, Waivers or Reductions provided under this Section IV.A., the matter shall be referred to the RCA Board of Directors for consideration and further action." The Board concurred with this recommendation.

11. **INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTION NO. 2016-016, RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE WESTERN RIVERSIDE COUNTY REGIONAL CONSERVATION AUTHORITY AMENDING ITS BYLAWS WITH REGARDS TO THE ELECTION OF OFFICERS**

Steven DeBaun, General Counsel, presented this item to the RCA Board as an introduction of the resolution. He explained how this request to amend the Bylaws pertaining to the election of officers came about. He further explained that the Executive Committee recommended amending the rotation of the Chairperson and Vice Chairperson from annually alternating between a member representing a City and member of the Board of Supervisors to instead require that at least once every three years, the Chairperson or Vice Chairperson shall be a regular member of the Board who is a member of the Board of Supervisors. He stated the reason for making this recommendation was to provide additional options for the Board of Directors when selecting the Chairperson and Vice Chairperson, as well as providing additional flexibility.

He further stated that Article IX, Section 3, Subsection A, requires that the Executive Committee shall be appointed by the Chairperson and ratified by the Board. After reviewing the methods used to appoint similar committees by WRCOG and RCTC, as shown on the chart attached to the staff report, the Executive Committee recommended not amending this section of the Bylaws.

Several Board Members asked questions with regard to the election of the members to the Executive Committee. After much discussion by Board Members, it was recommended that two Executive Committee members be selected by the entire Board and that the resolution be amended to allow two members of the Executive Committee be nominated and elected by the Board at-large and that the entire Executive Committee continue to be ratified by the Board.

After discussion by the Board, it was agreed that the election of the Executive Committee members continue to take place in December. Steve DeBaun summed up the discussion by indicating that the resolution will be amended and brought back for adoption at the November Board meeting, and that the Board meeting taking place this date is considered an introduction of the resolution since it has been fully discussed. There was no motion or vote to be taken on this agenda item.

12. **LAND ACQUISITION UPDATE**

Charles Landry, Executive Director, reported that as of the last RCA Board of Directors' meeting it was reported that RCA had 53,347 acres. In the last 30 days, RCA acquired two additional properties totaling approximately 87 acres, bringing the reserve total to approximately 53,434 acres.

13. ITEMS FOR NEXT MEETING

Board Member Brown asked for a future discussion regarding a Stakeholders Committee meeting. Charles Landry, Executive Director, stated that the Stakeholders Committee met 18 months ago at the request of the Chairperson, and there were not too many items to report on. Chairman Montanez suggested that staff coordinate a workshop in 2017 along with a Stakeholders Committee meeting, which will include a half day training for new members and the other half of the day for the Stakeholders meeting.

14. CLOSED SESSION ITEMS:

After Closed Session, the meeting was reconvened. There were no announcements from Closed Session.

15. ADJOURNMENT
