8.1 WESTERN RIVERSIDE COUNTY MSHCP FEE COLLECTION REPORT FOR AUGUST 2017

<u>Overview</u>

This item is for the RCA Board of Directors to receive and file the Western Riverside County MSHCP Fee Collection Report for September 2017.

9. RESOLUTION NO. 2017-006, RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE WESTERN RIVERSIDE COUNTY REGIONAL CONSERVATION AUTHORITY DECLARING SUPPORT FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF THE WESTERN RIVERSIDE COUNTY MULTIPLE SPECIES HABITAT CONSERVATION PLAN

Charles Landry, Executive Director, presented this item. He stated that at the June 5, 2017 Board of Directors meeting, Board Members expressed concerns regarding the imposition of land use restrictions that could affect firefighting roads, access to trails, and property rights within and adjacent to the boundaries of the proposed refuge. He advised that RCA staff, together with Vice Chairman Ingram and the Executive Committee, addressed these concerns.

He advised that the refuge was proposed in order to provide additional federal funding to the MSHCP. The state and federal governments are required to acquire one-third, or 56,000 acres of Additional Reserve Land. Currently, the only funds available to meet their obligation are through Section 6 Habitat Conservation Plan grant funds and state match. The Land and Water Conservation fund has approximately \$900 million allocated annually, versus Section 6 acquisition funding, which is approximately \$18 million annually. Establishing a refuge can benefit the Plan by providing additional federal funding and management of reserve lands.

The proposal is to establish a refuge in the eastern part of the Western Riverside County MSHCP where there is minimal population and development. The refuge will be established within the existing boundaries of the MSHCP and incorporate only existing Additional Reserve Land. The MSHCP will not expand past the requirements of the Plan nor increase the footprint. Private property rights will be fully protected in that the refuge will only be expanded when willing sellers ask to be included within the refuge. The acquisition process will use current MSHCP procedures and be performed by RCA. The resolution starts the process for RCA to negotiate with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. RCA staff will brief the Board on a regular basis on the status of the planning process if it is decided to move forward. Final terms and conditions of the refuge will be brought back to the Board for final approval prior execution of any agreement.

Chairman Ashley asked if there were any questions of the Board of Directors.

Vice Chairman Ingram stated that RCA has been working on this resolution for quite some time and will proceed with caution. It is his belief that establishing a refuge can provide an additional funding stream for RCA. He stated that the resolution is clear on its objective. He advised that he spoke to other Member Agencies and developers in an effort to craft a resolution that was both acceptable and beneficial. He reiterated that the adoption of this resolution is the first step in the process. He stressed the importance of the refuge and how additional funding will help get the MSHCP to its completion. He thanked RCA staff and legal counsel for their work in addressing issues raised.

Overview

10. LAND ACQUISITION UPDATE

Charles Landry, Executive Director, advised that escrow had not closed on any additional properties since the last Board meeting, but several are in the process. Currently, the reserve is at approximately 56,944 acres. Charles Landry was asked what percentage of the total the acreage represents, to which he responded approximately 37 percent.

13. FEATURED SPECIES OF THE MONTH

Elizabeth "Betsy" Dionne, Ecological Resources Specialist, presented the Engelmann Oak, the featured species for the month of October. She provided the background information on the Engelmann Oak and reported on the monitoring and management activities and goals for this species. She identified the Santa Rosa Plateau as having the highest concentration of the Engelmann Oaks in Riverside County. She advised that the oak can be found in the Santa Margarita Ecological Reserve and the Southwestern Riverside County Multi-Species Reserve. There are also small occurrences in Potrero, Sage and Palomar Mountain. She made reference to the early fossil record locations in California and Arizona. She gave a detailed description of how to identify the oak and how they reproduce. After her presentation, she invited questions from the Board Members. Several Board Members asked questions, and Betsy answered. Chairman Ashley thanked Betsy for a well-informed presentation.
