9. LAND ACQUISITION UPDATE

Charles Landry, Executive Director, stated that at the last RCA Board of Directors' meeting, it was reported that RCA had acquired 56,944 acres. Escrow has closed on four additional properties totaling approximately 200 acres, bringing the reserve total to approximately 57,144 acres.

10. FEATURED SPECIES OF THE MONTH

Elizabeth "Betsy" Dionne, Ecological Resources Specialist, stated that the featured species for the month of November is the long-tailed weasel. She explained that the weasel is a member of the mustelid family that includes ferrets, badgers, minks, otters and a variety of other species. Mustelids are unique in that they exhibit musk glade used to mark to their territory and scare off predators. The weasel has a widespread range throughout Canada, USA and Mexico. They are found in grasslands, but will utilize most habitats where small burrowing mammals are plentiful. They are mesocarnivore, which is a small meat-eating species. They play an important role in the ecosystem because they provide rodent population control and help contain the diseases that rodents tend to spread. Adults measure 12-14 inches in length with a long tail which makes up about 50 percent of their total body length. Males are larger than females. They mate in July-August and their gestation period is about 10 months and a littler of 5-8 kits are born in the spring. At birth, kits are blind, have little fur, and weigh only about 3 grams. They exhibit rapid growth and at five weeks of age will accompany their mothers on hunting trips. The lifespan of the long-tailed weasel is not well known, but the closely related species of weasel live approximately 4-6 years.

Betsy Dionne also reported on the monitoring, management activities and goals for this species. The monitoring objectives for this species include documenting occurrence within 75% of the localities the species are known to occur. The long-tailed weasel cannot be documented well using camera traps because they are too fast and too low to the ground so scent stations are used instead. Scent stations are set up by spreading fine sand evenly over a 2-foot diameter circle. A very pungent scent tablet is placed at the center of the station which will attract many different animals, including the long-tailed weasel. These scent stations are checked and reset every day, and all tracks are recorded. The weasel can be easily distinguished from other small animals that have checked into the scent station because of their distinct track patterns, which include parallel track patterns, a hoping gait, five toes, and paw prints that are wider than they are long.

After her presentation, Betsy Dionne invited and responded to questions from the Board Members. Chairman Ashley and Board Members thanked Betsy Dionne for a well-informed presentation.
